DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY AND DISASTER
EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2-2020
(LA MESA MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2.56)

WHEREAS conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property resulted in the City of La Mesa due to rioting and looting related to a police protest on May 30, 2020;

WHEREAS rioting and looting activities on May 30 and May 31, 2020, resulted in damage to structures in the general area of said activities;

WHEREAS the economic impacts of COVID-19 have been significant, and could threaten to undermine the stability of La Mesa businesses;

WHEREAS the unexpected costs of repair are a substantial burden to those that suffered damage due to rioting and looting activities, which is amplified by the COVID-19 crisis;

WHEREAS, the typical costs of obtaining permits to perform repair work would be an added significant burden to business and property owners that could delay or prevent repair work from occurring in a timely manner, and

WHEREAS the City desires to help relieve the burden of repair and recovery for businesses and property owners that sustained damage.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Greg Humora, Director of Emergency and Disaster of the City of La Mesa, California, pursuant to La Mesa Municipal Code Chapter 2.56, do hereby issue the following order to become effective immediately:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1) All fees related to obtaining permits and inspections for repair work to recover from damage sustained during rioting and looting on May 30 and May 31, 2020, shall be waived.

I FURTHER DIRECT that as soon as hereafter possible, this order be filed with the City Clerk, posted on the City's website and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Order.
